### WHAT'S INVOLVED

The equine industry has a number of unit standard resources (from level one through to four) available for high school students to work on either by correspondence or in a small classroom environment with other students who are also interested in the equine athlete.

The students have access to first class workbooks, resources and assessments that have embedded numeracy and literacy and were developed by industry professionals.



# WHAT TO DO NEXT

If you would like to work on equine unit standards and have these credited to your NCEA talk to your Gateway/Star advisor as to whether you would be a suitable candidate. Then you or your advisor can contact an education team member from Equine Education Trust in an area near you to progress your learning further.

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




## SO YOU ARE INTERESTED IN HORSES?

Recognising the need to educate and inform the younger members of our communities about the horse and the racing industry, under their provider the NZ Equine Education Trust now offer equine training for high school students.

Gateway and Star programs are offered at most high schools throughout New Zealand and senior students that have an interest in the horse now have the opportunity to add equine unit standards to their NCEA Record of Learning.





### GATEWAY

Gateway delivery involves arranging structured workplace learning with the following characteristics:

- A formalised learning arrangement set in the workplace
- Clear understandings about the knowledge and skills to be attained by learners
- Clear understandings about the assessment method used (workplace learning).

There is no cost to learners. Schools must comply with the requirements of Condition GAT017 which specifies the learning environment, health and safety requirements, and the information needs of learners and stakeholders.



### WORKING WITH SCHOOLS

As a provider for the NZ Equine Education Trust, the staff listed will work with each individual school to:

- Provide suitable workplace placement for students
- Provide each student with a clear guide to the requirements they must meet to achieve each unit standard
- Provide tutors, workbooks, resource materials, assessors and assessments for each individual student in their chosen unit standard
- Provide reports with each individual students achievements to the school so credits can be registered with NZQA
