


HISTORY – Past Handicapping Systems

- **1994 Tiered Racing Metro/Country (G/M)**
- **1997 Class System Returns (incl' Novice Races, C1 W\$ threshold)**
- 2001 Conditioned System (saw much adaptation; e.g. concessions, incl' Tuesday racing)
- **2013 Class System Returns (including new Dropback System)**
- 2016 Ratings System trial in North Island
- **2017** (March) Nationwide rollout of Ratings System



CURRENT SITUATION- The Numbers





IDENTIFIED ISSUES IN OUR RACING- Four Key Areas

- Lack of opportunities for average to poor maiden horses
- Extend the racing life of those good enough to only win one race
- Concessions viewed as too favourable to "better" horses
- Dropback System & Concession causes bottleneck in lower grades



PITFALLS OF THE CURRENT SYSTEM

- A win is a win is a win...
- Concessions allow better horses to win more, at the expense of others
- Concessions also limit horses' progression through the classes
- Out of form horses get little relief
- Dropback system causes bottleneck in lower grades
- Conditions proved ad hoc or were a band aid solution
- Perception; horses reach mark & are then uncompetitive



THE POSSIBLE SOLUTIONS?

- Apply different tactics with race programming & stakes policies
- Make changes to the existing Handicapping System
- Trial a completely new system



THE AGREED SOLUTION – Points-Based Ratings System

Why?

Greater fluidity within system – movement 1



- Penalties for winning races more relative
 Age Group concessions brought more into balance
- Creation of additional "classes" of racing better catering for all horses
- Looking to create fuller, more balanced fields
- Help keep horses racing viably in NZ



HOW THIS SYSTEM CAME ABOUT

- April 2016 Initial Ratings Proposal from Trainers & Drivers Assn (on behalf of Owners/Breeders)
- Handicapping Sub-Committee approve to investigate proposal in principle
- June 2016 new Rating System developed and approved by Handicapping Sub-Committee & HRNZ Board
- Trial implemented 1 August in North Island
- November 2016 HRNZ Board approve Ratings System to be rolled out nationwide. Based on positive KPIs: Increased field sizes in northern region, increase turnover per race.
- Note: Ongoing enhancements; part of the natural evolution of the Ratings System

THE RATINGS SYSTEM

- Horses start on 50 points max 130, min 40
- Wins \$9,000 or under = 8 points pacers/ 6 trotters
- Wins \$9,001-\$19,999 = 10 points pacers/ 8 trotters
- Wins \$20,000+ & Group/Listed = 10-15 points
- Second to fourth = 1 point (in general with discretion)
- Fifth or further back = -1 point (can be up to -3)
- Handicapper's Discretion applies (mainly downwards)



- Maiden Wins \$9000 or less go to R52-R55
- Maiden Winners \$9,001-\$19,999 go to R55-R58
- Race-winners that win must go to at least R52 regardless of how lowly they are rated
- No 2YO rated higher than R85
- No 3YO Rated higher than R110



- Maidens (non-winners) treated separately
- Identified differently within the system (MR)
- Maidens second to fourth = +1 points
- Maidens fifth & further back = -1 point
- Maidens capped at 55 points
- Maiden winners rated above 50 re-rated from 50 points



- Fillies & Mares Concessions apply
- Junior Drivers race winners Rating Penalty Free
- No Penalty Free status for Invited Drivers races, except significant events approved by HRNZ Board
- > 2YOs in 2YO races under \$15,000 half points
- 3YOs receive moderated concessions. Every 2nd win ½ points if under \$15,000
- Handicapper's Discretion to apply more in higher rated races - Diminishing Scale of Ratings for winning



- Placed horses in races over \$9,000 increase 1 point
- Placed horses earning over \$2,000 increase 1 point
- Placed horses in standard races increased 1 point but not beyond their last winning rating.
- Placed horses (2nd or 3rd) with a Rating of R49 or increase by 1 point – at discretion of Handicapper
- Claimers race for '0' points (no movement up or down)
- Connections unhappy with Ratings can appeal



HOW THE HORSES WERE RATED

- Applying Guiding Principles from start of horses' careers
- Using assessment as the guide e.g. C0=R50. C2=R66. C6=R92
- Assessing how horses fit into the overall population
- Applying concession to fillies & mares where appropriate
- Finding and fixing any anomalies that appear
- Horses treated as similar as possible in North & South Island



KEYS TO SUCCESS

- Industry buy-in
- Education of industry participants
- Appropriate stakes policies from harness racing clubs
- More centralised & open-ended programming
- Making better use of the existing horse population
- > An emphasis on the punter and education
- Ongoing review & refinement



THE WIDER BENEFITS

- Better stakes structure will aid the system
- Likelihood of more movement of horses around NZ
- Increased earning capacity of greater horse population
- More centralised programming to aid spread of horses




MEASURES OF SUCCESS

- Increased average field sizes
- Increases in number of races run
- Increased starts per horse
- Positive impact on turnovers
- Decreases in short priced favourites & winners
- Positive impact on the "Competitive Index" scale
